BUSHFIRE SEASON: 1st October to 31st March

- FIRE DANGER RATING
- Not likelihood of fire but danger of fire once started
- High Rating
 - Monitor conditions
- Severe Rating
 - Leave early safest option
- Extreme Rating
 - Leave early safest option
- Catastrophic
 - Leave early is the only option











Emergency Warning

An Emergency Warning is the highest level of Bush Fire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk.



Watch and Act

There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family.



Advice

A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.



Cross-border Incident

An incident that exists in another state near the NSW border.



Not Applicable

A non-bush fire incident where no alert level is assigned.



Watch Zone

A specified area which you have selected to monitor for any fire activity. Push notifications need to be enabled.





BUSHFIRE ALERT LEVEL & STATUS

Status	Description
Out of Control	A fire which is spreading on one or more fronts. Effective containment strategies are not in place for the entire perimeter.
Being Controlled	Effective strategies are in operation or planned for the entire perimeter.
Under Control	The fire is at a stage where fire fighting resources are only required for patrol purposes and major re-ignition is unlikely.
Alert Level	Description
Emergency Warning	An Emergency Warning is the highest level of Bush Fire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk.
Watch and Act	There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family.
Advice	A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.




- Bushfire Survival Plan

- Know what to do if you get caught in a fire









1. Executive Summary

- Commitments for the release of land for the Molonglo commercial centre have been made by the ACT Government in response to public concerns associated with the slow pace of development of the Coombs centre and increasing pressure on the Cooleman Court centre. Public expectations for a speedy process that will deliver a quality centre are high.
- With the Molonglo and North Weston Structure Plan in place there is no impediment to proceeding to finalise detailed planning and design for the commercial centre and adjacent residential and community land which will allow the release of sites for development. This should be done by way of the estate development plan (EDP) process
- Whilst the preparation of a Concept Plan is an option it is not recommended because it would not add quality to the planning outcome, over and above what can be achieved through the EDP process; also, it would add at least 18 months to the timeframe with the result that the Government commitment for the delivery of the commercial centre would be unable to be met.




- A full Territory Plan Variation will not be required to deliver the Molonglo Commercial Centre

Coombs Section 17, Block 3




- Concept design for an eating disorder residential treatment centre on part of the block

 A development application has been lodged for a second 1,500m² supermarket at the **Koko Molonglo** site in Wright






Location

Bluett's an Environmental

asset!

Varied habitat types

(wide variety, including threatened Box gum/grassy woodland)



(very varied, including abundant and rare orchid species)

Significant fauna

(many bird species, including threatened Superb Parrots and Chestnut-rumped Heath Wren)

Wildlife corridor

(provides link between Canberra Nature Parks, north to south)







Bluett's a vital wildlife corridor

Bluett's provides a corridor between Molonglo River Reserve and nearby protected areas

- ➤ Currently **Bluett's Block** provides corridor for birds and mammals to move across wooded areas, Molonglo River to Murrumbidgee River
- ➤ Extends corridor from north of Canberra, through Mt Painter, Kama Reserve to Molonglo River Reserve and into Stromlo Forests and other southern nature parks



Bluett's a Social Amenity!

- Walking paths
 (for recreation and exercise)
- Exposure to nature

(opportunity to restore connections with nature)

Closely available natural area for education

(available for nearby school excursions, research on ecology, restoration of natural environment, wildlife)

Benefits to Molonglo Community to have a Nature Reserve rather than further urban area





Molonglo Valley Plan for the Protection of Matters of National Environmental Significance (NES Plan 2011)

'... **establishment and implementation** of the following **principles**:

- strong connections to the surroundings;
- a response to the strong topographic character of the Valley;
- protection of hills, ridges and views;
- retention of significant trees and shrubs;
- protection of significant natural corridors and habitats.'

Gives strong reasons for protection of Bluett's Block as Nature Reserve







- <u>Fire</u>
- **Invasive plants**
- **Eucalyptus dieback**
- Feral animals









Threats from Development as urban area:

- Loss of old growth trees that provide nesting sites for vulnerable Superb Parrots
- Loss of nationally listed Yellow box Apple Box tall grassy woodland that provides feeding and breeding areas for native fauna
- Loss of further rocky outcrop areas that provide habitat for Pink-tailed Worm Lizard
- Free-ranging cats and foxes kill native birds, lizards and

small mammals





Our hope for Future of Bluett's/Blewitt's Block?

- Ongoing enjoyment by Molonglo Valley residents and others of this wonderful bushland
- Legal protection by incorporation into the Canberra Nature Parks system
 - With consequent management of weeds, bushfire risks and feral animals; and
 - > Formation of a Friends Group to assist with management

Efforts so far:

- > Collection of information for development of submissions for protection
- ➤ Lobbying ACT Government Ministers Vassarotti & Gentleman
- Gaining support of the Conservation Council of the ACT Region
- ➤ Contacting ACT Park Rangers & ACT Conservator of Environment
- ➤ Met with Molonglo Valley Community Forum representatives
- Organising walks
- Building community awareness
- Presenting to Canberra Ornithologists Group
- Using Canberra Nature Map and other resources
- Developing Bluett's Block Facebook
- Meeting with Capital Development Project officers
