



MOLONGLO TOWN CENTRE FORUM RECOMMENDATION:

"The first step towards accommodating [an ultimate population] of 86,000 residents] should be the reclassification of the Molonglo Group Centre to "Town Centre" status.

To provide sufficient time for this reclassification to be factored into the future development of the centre, this change should take place with the commencement of the new Territory Plan [in 2023-24], rather than at some undefined point in the future."



MOLONGLO TOWN CENTRE ACT GOVERNMENT'S RESPONSE:

The economic access driver identifies that one direction is the transition of Molonglo group centre to a town centre in future with an accommodation, hospitality and food focus to support recreation and tourism activities in the district. This is a long-term strategy. Typically, a town centre offers employment opportunities and provides higher order retail facilities, offices and consulting rooms; cultural, community and public administration; entertainment, educational, religious and residential facilities. Molonglo should not be upgraded to a town centre until it has been developed to provide these services.

MOLONGLO RIVER BRIDGE UPDATE

Molonglo River Bridge Crossing

Current update

The detailed design and construction tender has been awarded to B.M.D Construction Pty Ltd. Detailed design is expected to start in the coming months and be complete in late 2023 with major works commencing soon after. The bridge and approaching roads are expected to be complete and open to traffic by the end of 2025.

Start date: early works expected to commence mid-2023

Completion date: the road approaches and bridge are expected to open to traffic in December 2025.

MOLONGLO RIVER BRIDGE UPDATE

Key features

- 227.5 metre Molonglo River Bridge (23-metres high) and approximately 1.7 kilometres of arterial approach roads (one-kilometre to the south and the rest to the north).
- Public transport infrastructure including a southbound queue jump bus lane (on the northern side of the bridge), two bus stops, and provision for future light rail infrastructure.
- On road cycle lanes and off-road shared paths to support the active travel network and provide access to the Molonglo River Reserve.
- Integration with the Molonglo Group Centre (MGC) south of the bridge including a pedestrian underpass of John Gorton Drive adjacent to the MGC.
- Incorporation of a services corridor, including electricity, across the Molonglo River to allow the full development of Molonglo.
- Five signalised intersections (three associated with the MGC masterplan).
- Provision of habitat for native fauna such as platypus nesting sites, striped legless lizards, water birds and bats.

- Integration with the Molonglo Group Centre (MGC) south of the bridge including a pedestrian underpass of John Gorton Drive adjacent to the MGC.
- Incorporation of a services corridor, including electricity, across the Molonglo River to allow the full development of Molonglo and Denman Prospect.
- Two new intersections including one connecting into the Molonglo Group Centre.
- Provision of habitat for native fauna such as platypus nesting sites, pink-tailed worm lizards, water birds and bats.
